


Book Report Choice Board

Directions: Choose one project to complete for your summer reading book. Be ready to bring your project with you on the first day of school.

Design a comic strip illustrating a summary of the book. Can be done on paper or digitally .	Design a poster about the book.	Redesign the front cover using a major scene from the text.
Create a different ending to the book.	Design a diorama of a major scene in the book.	Write a summary of the book.
Design a t-shirt based on your book.	Write a letter to the author sharing your thoughts about the book.	Create a timeline of the major events that happened in the book.

Poster



Design a poster summarizing the book.

Make sure you include the main characters, setting, problem and solution, and pictures.

Comic Strip



Design a comic strip illustrating a summary of the book.


Summarize the book and make it into a comic strip.

Your comic strip should include the main characters, setting, dialogue, the problem and solution.

Your comic strip should have 6-10 panels (boxes).

It can be done on paper or [digitally](#).

Redesign the Front Cover



Draw a picture of a major event in the book (don't give away the ending!)

Be sure to include the title and author. Give yourself credit too!

Write a Different Ending

How could the book have ended differently?

Write a new chapter (not just a few sentences!) to end the book.

Include settings, characters, dialogue, and narration.

Write it as a story! Make it fun!

Diorama



A diorama is a 3-D scene from a book or text.

Choose a major event from the story, gather your materials, and design your diorama.

Material suggestions: shoe box, glue, scissors, popsicle sticks, markers/ crayons/ colored pencils, cotton balls, sticks, and anything else you can think of!

Write a Summary

Write a summary of the book.

Paragraph #1- Introduce the characters, setting, and what happens in the beginning of the book.

Paragraph #2- Explain the problem in the book.

Paragraph #3- Explain the solution to the problem.

Each paragraph should be at least 4 sentences.

Design a T-Shirt



Design a t-shirt of your book.

Be sure to include the title and author, characters, and setting of your book.

Write a letter to the author of your book.


Include a greeting, a heading, the body of your letter, a closing, and your signature.
