This week you will receive your student's report card (Grades 1-Grades 6). Report Cards are one of many ways that our teachers help you and your child know how they are making progress towards meeting grade level expectations. Grade level expectations incorporate the specific skills for their grade, the habits they develop as learners and problem solvers, and the ways they engage both independently and collaboratively in social and academic spaces.



As we begin to close the 2021 year, this is an important time to engage with your child in reflecting on the school year and reviewing their report card.

Here are some questions you can use to review the report card together:

- What is a topic you learned about this term? What is something you want to learn more about?
- What is an area (domain and/or specific standard) you are proud of? What did you do at home and at school to make this progress?
- Who helped you make progress this term (a family member, a friend, a classmate, and/or a Roger Clap staff member)?
- What is an area you want to focus on for the winter term? Who can you share this goal with?
